The Parish Council appreciates the efforts of Park, Playground Action for Rayne Kids, in its fundraising for a new play area that will meet the latest safety regulations and provide the much needed upgrading of the play area.

Police

Relationships between the Police and the Parish Council are very good. Many parishioners now report incidents to the clerk who forwards these to our Police Officer, Natasha Keaney. This year has seen numerous letters being sent to motorists parking illegally on the pedestrian crossing in the Village and visits to those reported for a range of offences or anti social behaviour.
